A ROYAL NAME-CHANGE

It's been a familiar sight at the bottom of the Royal Mile for some time, but in 2024 the Queen's Gallery, located by the gates to the Palace of Holyroodhouse, is to become the King's Gallery to reflect the fact that His Majesty King Charles III now sits on the throne.

The Edinburgh gallery was built between 1999 and 2002, in what was once a 19th-century Holyrood Free Church and Duchess of Gordon's School and is renowned for showing some of the incredible pieces in the Royal Collection, held in trust by the Sovereign for his successors and the nation.

The name of the Queen's Gallery at Buckingham Palace, in London, will also now be known as the King's Gallery to reflect this new era of monarchy.

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
